Exclave and enclave

- An exclave is a portion of a state or territory geographically separated from the main part by surrounding alien territory (of one or more states).
- Nakhchivan is an example of an exclave. It is a territory of Azerbaijan, but it borders Armenia, Iran and Turkey







Exclave and enclave

An enclave is a territory that is entirely surrounded by the territory of one other state


• The <u>Vatican City State</u> and <u>San Marino</u>, both enclaved by <u>Italy</u>

• An historical example was <u>West Berlin</u> from 1945 till the reunification of <u>Germany</u>.






Croatian and Bosnian border around Neum, BH






Dubrovnik exclave Dubrovnik- Neretva County











Bosnia and Herzegovina claims

- BH claims that the bridge blocks their ship traffic, even though they have no port at all, nor locations suitable for ports
- The reason for this claim would be a better starting positions in trade negotiatins about the Croatian port of Ploče, close to the Bosnian costal strech.
- Consequently, the height of the bridge was lifted up.
